Scripture Text:

Zechariah 9:9 Rejoice, O people of Zion! Shout in triumph, O people of Jerusalem! Look, your King is coming to you. He is righteous and victorious, yet He is humble, riding on a donkey—riding on a donkey’s colt.

TRUTHS TO HOLD ONTO TIGHTLY:

1. Jesus is the true _____ of _____ and _____.

a. Zechariah 9:9 Rejoice, O people of Zion! Shout in triumph, O people of Jerusalem! Look, your King is coming to you. He is righteous and victorious, yet He is humble, riding on a donkey—riding on a donkey’s colt.

b. John 12:13 (They) took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, and cried out: “Hosanna! ‘Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!’ The King of Israel!”

c. Matthew 28:18 Jesus came and told his disciples, “I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth.

TRUTHS TO HOLD ONTO TIGHTLY:

2. Jesus is the _____ that _____ the sin of the world.

a. John 1:29 The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, “Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!

b. Mark 10:33-34 (Jesus stated) “Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and to the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and deliver Him to the Gentiles; 34 and they will mock Him, and scourge Him, and spit on Him, and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again.”

TRUTHS TO HOLD ONTO TIGHTLY:

3. Jesus brings _____ to the _____ of God in the New Covenant.

a. Genesis 49:10-11 The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh [sent Messiah] comes; and to Him shall be the obedience of the people. 11 Binding his donkey to the vine, and his donkey’s colt to the choice vine, He washed his garments in wine, and his clothes in the blood of grapes.

b. Psalm 118:25-26 Lord, save us! Lord, grant us success! 26 Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. From the house of the Lord we bless you.

2 Corinthians 1:20 For all of God’s promises have been fulfilled in Christ with a resounding “Yes!” And through Christ, our “Amen” (which means “Yes”) ascends to God for his glory.

b. Matthew 21:6 The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them.

2. Don’t stay _____ just because the _____ says to.

a. Luke 19:39-40 Some of the Pharisees from the crowd told Him, “Teacher, rebuke Your disciples.” 40 He answered, “I tell you, if they were to keep silent, the stones would cry out!”

LESSONS FROM THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY OF JESUS:

3. Don't _____ for an _____ appearance only.

a. Mark 11:13-14 He noticed a fig tree in full leaf a little way off, so he went over to see if he could find any figs. But there were only leaves because it was too early in the season for fruit. 14 Then Jesus said to the tree, “May no one ever eat your fruit again!” And the disciples heard him say it.

b. There must be _____.

c. Matthew 23:27-28 (Jesus said) “Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! You are like whitewashed tombs, which appear beautiful on the outside, but inside are full of the bones of the dead and every kind of impurity.

LESSONS FROM THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY OF JESUS:

4. The House of God must be _____ to help a world that is _____.

a. Luke 19:45-46 He went into the temple and began to throw out those who were selling, 46 and he said, “It is written, my house will be a house of prayer, but you have made it a den of thieves!”

b. Isaiah 56:7-8 I will bring them to my holy mountain of Jerusalem and will fill them with joy in my house of prayer. I will accept their burnt offerings and sacrifices, because my Temple will be called a house of prayer for all nations. 8 For the Sovereign Lord, who brings back the outcasts of Israel, says: I will bring others, too, besides my people Israel.”

LESSONS FROM THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY OF JESUS:

5. _____ our _____ in doing God's will.

a. Isaiah 41:10 “Do not fear, do not be dismayed, for I am with you. I will strengthen you and I will help you. I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.”

b. 1 Corinthians 2:9 But as it is written: “Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him.”

c. John 12:23-27 Jesus replied to them, “The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. 24 Truly I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains by itself. But if it dies, it produces much fruit. 25 The one who loves his life will lose it, and the one who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. 26 If anyone serves me, he must follow me. Where I am, there my servant also will be. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him. 27 “Now my soul is troubled. What should I say—Father, save me from this hour? But that is why I came to this hour.
